Facilities Update

as of 26 June 2023

Below are several of the projects where our Facilities, Maintenance, or Building and Grounds departments are involved:

Middle School Project

Phase II of this project is beginning to move forward – we have painted walls and ceilings and begun the electrical work and lighting. We will follow up with installing windows, ledges, an interior door or two, and building HVAC closets. If all goes according to plan and the weather isn't horrible, we should get this wrapped up in the next 8-9 months.

Simulation Labs and MLT

I reported last meeting the architectural drawings for our Medical Lab Technician project at DQ as well as the Simulation Labs on the four campuses were received – they were approved, allowing us to get these projects started. I'm working with our administrative agent, S.W. AR Planning and Development District (SWAPDD) to determine the next steps and should be able to give you a more definitive timeline on starting next meeting.

Welding Shop Expansion – Lockesburg

The red iron for the 30 ft x 80 ft additional grinding and welding shop area is up, and we will soon have sheet metal going on. We are hopeful to have this shop ready for students shortly after the fall semester begins.

Other projects

- the *Blue Darter Heritage Days* paver project. (Pavers are purchased and on-site.) We plan to take bricks to sandblaster within two weeks. Contacting a vendor currently on installing the pavers into the islands.
- We continue our work with several of our UA universities, colleges, and partners to develop a collaborative solar project beneficial to the whole System. More information will be available soon through communication via UA System office.
- Aerial Lineman Pole Yard in DQ poles are up, trucks are approved and ordered side x sides are approved and ordered bucket trucks ordered and due to arrive soon
- Cybersecurity Lab NV campus Electrical is to be complete the week of 30 June. Ceiling to be installed the following week, and then we will be ready for IT to finalize.

UA Cossatot is a one-stop provider for Arkansas National Career Readiness Certification (AR NCRC®). The primary purpose of the *free* Arkansas National Career Readiness Certificate Program is to positively impact the economy in Arkansas by helping job seekers build their workplace skills, respond to employer needs, and increase the likelihood of a job seeker's success.

The CRC team consisting of staff members associated with multiple departments within the college:

- Verify job seekers have an Arkansas Job Link Account
- Administer WorkKeys Curriculum Pretests to determine if the job seeker is ready to take the WorkKeys assessments
- Provide remediation training using WorkKeys Curriculum, if the individual does not score adequately on the WorkKeys Curriculum Pretest
- Conducts WorkKeys Assessments
- Prints and distributes AR National Career Readiness Certificates (AR NCRCs) to successful examinees
- 3. The new Aerial Lineman Instructor, Dennis Davis, was onboarded in May. He quickly familiarized himself with the scope of the project and initiated next steps to continue readying the program for launch. Despite persisting supply-chain issues, the final fleet items have been located, purchased, and delivery is pending. The list of backordered equipment and instructional materials is growing smaller as orders are now arriving at a much faster pace. The training schedule will be published and registration will be opened when the delivery dates for essential equipment and supplies are made known by the vendors.
- 4. The Workforce Development Coordinator position has been advertised. Candidates will be interviewed in July.

MINUTES OF MEETING COSSATOT COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF ARKANSAS BOARD OF VISITORS May 1, 2023

Chair Tyler Davis called the regular meeting of the Board of Visitors to order at 12:01 p.m. following a light meal at the UA Cossatot Lockesburg Community Room.

Staff Reports

Chancellor Cole introduced our guest Madelyn Jones as the new Foundation and Advancement Director for the college. Madelyn joins UA Cossatot after six years working at the University of Arkansas Fayetteville. She will be responsible for overseeing all aspects of UA Cossatot's Foundation and Advancement programming.

Chancellor Cole presented the Chancellors report on Relearning Managing People. Our college received the results of our annual survey "Are We Making Progress". Chancellor Cole spoke about a clear pattern from the results that seemed to deal with stress and burnout. Covid changed the workplace, and we hope to work away from that and improve the college. There has been a committee in place to find ways that the college can better understand and manage it. At the next Faculty/Staff meeting it will focus on a burnout topic. Dr. Cole added the college is looking to purchase YOU software that will be useful for mental health for students and employees.

Vice Chancellor Charlotte presented the most recent financial report to the board. At the end of March in the summary of Unrestricted & Auxiliary Revenues/Expenditures, total revenues are running up at about 9.2 million. The college has managed to hold the expenditure down at 8.2 million. Accounts Receivable are up from this time last year at \$266,000. Charlotte noted this has dropped from the previous month as students are gradually paying their bills. In Grants & Other Restricted Programs the college is up over 13 million in grants. One new grant has been awarded to the college and will start June 1. UA Cossatot has earned to date 3.5 million in grants.

In the Schedule of Bank Accounts, the college is up at 5.8 million in the bank. Charlotte proceeded to inform that the college is at 124,000 in Schedule of Endowment total funds, this is an increase compared to this time last year. Charlotte provided the board with a copy of the quarterly reports that were submitted to the UA System.

Vice Chancellor Dr. Ashley Aylett presented the latest Academic Services report. Dr. Aylett reported the Accreditation Team attended the Higher Learning Commission conference in March to help the college prepare for our upcoming Assurance Argument and our HLC site visit. The site visit is scheduled to take place in October 2023. Financial Aid had a good on-site VA Audit on March 29. Arkansas Community Colleges hosted a Mid-Level manager training on our campus on March 31 that included topics in

Managing in Higher Education:

- Execution in Leadership
- Employee Engagement
- Supervision
- Budgeting
- Time Management
- Communication

The college also had a site visit for International Student on April 11th. This visit was to align us to accept international students once again to our campuses. We are awaiting feedback from this visit. Dr. Aylett informed us that both our OTA and PTA programs stood at 100% pass rate for December 2022 graduates. Medical will have a Board of Nursing site visit in May. Trends of total withdraws in comparison were explained to the board. UA Cossatot has scheduled graduation to be held May 12th at 7:00p.m. at the De Queen Amphitheater weather permitting. Dr. Aylett shared the Spring predicted numbers.

Total awards: 439Total graduates: 210

• High School student awards: 85

• High school students: 50

Students enrolled for the Summer 2023 the college has 318 enrolled compared to 281 in 2022 and 320 in 2021 at this time. Students enrolled for Fall 2023 are 594 enrolled compared to 597 in 2022 and 538 in 2021.

Vice Chancellor of Facilities Mike Kinkade reported on the current projects on all campuses. Mike has received approval from ANCRC and has begun cleaning out stored items and "demo-ing" old electrical conduit and light fixtures at the Lockesburg Middle School. The plan is to make office and storage space in this area. Mike mentioned they have recently met with the administrative agent, S.W. AR Planning and Development District (SWAPDD) to determine the next steps and are currently soliciting bids for a general contractor to work on federally funded projects. Another project in the works is to expand the welding shop in Lockesburg by adding a 30 ft x 90 ft additional shop. Blue Darter Heritage Days paver project is moving forward and will meet with engravers to get pricing for engraved. The solar project is ongoing with several other UA universities, colleges, and partners. Mike stated poles are up for the Aerial Lineman Pole Yard in De Queen. Other equipment has been approved and ordered.

CURRICULAR AND CO-CURRICULAR ASSESSMENT

- Quality education is provided through an outcomes-based curriculum <u>centered around college core</u> abilities.
 - a. The *Communication* core ability includes skills such as reading, writing, speaking, citations, and teamwork.
 - b. The *Occupational Skills* core ability consists of safety and employability skills and encompasses pertinent occupation-specific skills for the Skilled and Technical Sciences and Medical Education students, although Professional Studies and General Education may have some as well.
 - c. The *Life Skills* core ability measures student learning in the areas of leadership, problem solving and critical thinking.
 - d. The *Technology* core ability includes all technological skills that students use for learning, including but not limited to microscopes, computers (hardware, software), calculators, and industry specific tools.
 - e. The *Social Values* core ability comprises cultural diversity, social responsibility, public issues, academic integrity, and ethics.
- The administration has established an assessment council to periodically assess the effectiveness of the curriculum and co-curricular activities.
- Each division has an established assessment process-follows the established Assessment Plan, found on the website.
- Co-curricular assessment processes are also located in the Assessment Plan. UA Cossatot defines co-curricular activities as experiences that are hands-on, future focused, put ideas into practice, and showcase achievements. Through participation in co-curricular activities, students have the opportunity to establish relationships, develop multicultural awareness, and create a sense of community while developing leadership and social skills.
